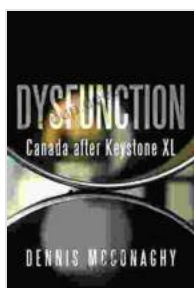


Dysfunction in Canada After Keystone XL

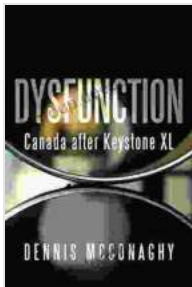

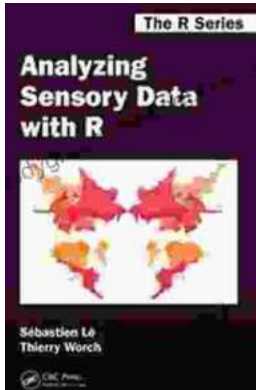

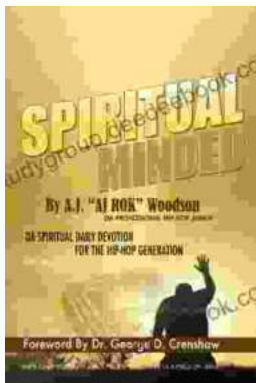
