
# From Karaoke to the Platters: A Musical Journey of Harmony and Heartbreak

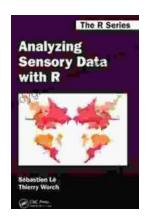

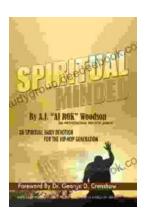
