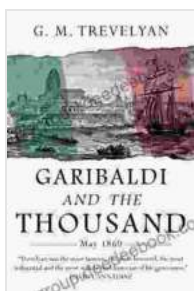

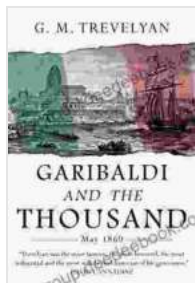

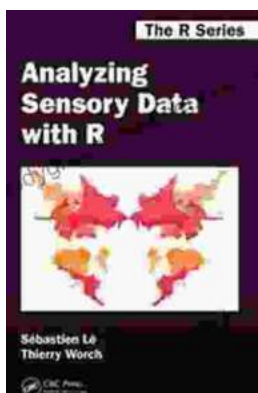

Garibaldi and the Thousand, May 1860 (Garibaldi Trilogy Book 2) by George Macaulay Trevelyan

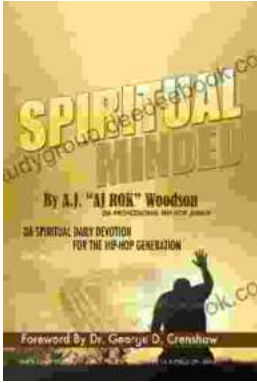
